



Common Questions About Growing **HYDROPONIC DILL**

Can dill be grown in hydroponic systems?

Yes, dill grows remarkably well in hydroponic systems. The seeds typically take 7 to 14 days to germinate, and once they start growing, they thrive in the nutrient-rich environment. How do you grow dill for both the garden and cooking?

To grow dill from cuttings, select a stem with at least 3 to 4 inches of new growth. Within 2 to 3 weeks, roots will begin to develop, and you can transfer the cutting into soil or a hydroponic system.

Can dill grow indoors successfully?
